Lousma – NASA Astronaut and retired Marine Corps Colonel, Donald E. Odell – Vietnam prisoner of war for over five years; and

WHEREAS, The six veterans inductees represent extraordinary accomplishments in the community and include: Joe Louis Barrow Sr. – World Heavyweight Boxing Champion, Tyrone Chatman – Awarded "Spirit of Detroit" award six times, John D. Dingell Jr. – Longest serving Congressman in history, Michael Ilitch Sr. – Detroit Red Wings and Detroit Tigers owner, Keith K. King – The National Veterans Small Business Champion and Vince W. Patton – Master Chief Petty Officer of the Coast Guard, and Petty Officer 1<sup>st</sup> Class Roger L. Yoder of Jerome; and
